

Okavango Explore the famous northern Okavango and Moremi Game Reserve, with permanent and seasonally flooded areas laced with islands, lagoons, pools and rivers. Grasslands, cool mopane forests, woodlands and savanna are home to a vast array of wildlife.

Kalahari The Central Kalahari Game Reserve is the largest reserve in southern Africa. It has relatively low rainfall but is not a true desert with grasses, trees and shrubs occurring in great variety. The true sense of Africa, particularly under a clear night sky is awe-inspiring. Join local Kalahari 'Bushmen' who will take you on food-collecting walks.

Nxai Pan Nxai Pan National Park is part of the vast chain of salt pans that link the Okavango and the Kalahari. Here you will find Springbok and Impala. Baines Baobabs are situated on the edge of one of these pans where the star-gazing is a unique experience.

Chobe Chobe National Park, a verdant floodplain in northern Botswana is famous for its abundance of elephants, the highest concentration in Africa. Take a river cruise on the Chobe and count the hippos!

Tsodilo Tsodilo Hills rises majestically above the surrounding sandveld and is Botswana's only World Heritage Site. With over 4500 paintings, it has amongst the highest concentrations of rock art in the world.

See uses of traditional medicines, how houses are constructed as well as their beautiful baskets with the opportunity to purchase directly from the women.
